It is with great joy and excitement that The City of Pratt is announcing an incredible opportunity for our community. On Monday, June 16, 2025, the City of Pratt Commission heard a proposed path forward for The Point Project from the City Manager, Regina Goff and donor representative Zach Deeds. The Point is a project that has been in the works for many years east of The Bill Keller Family Sports Complex track. While initially focused on adding needed amenities to both The Bill Keller Family and Green Sports Complexes, the project has evolved into 86,000 square feet of sports, recreation, event, and tourism space dedicated to significantly expanding Pratt's already vibrant tourism economy.

The Point will be the conveniently located home of The City of Pratt Recreation offices and Visit Pratt, a welcoming visitor center and hub of Pratt tourism. It will provide amenities such as locker rooms, bathrooms, concessions, event rooms including a premier second story suite, six multi-sport courts, a dedicated four-mat wrestling center, a 100' X 150' free-span turf field, and ample spectator space and accommodations. Outside amenities include multiple pickleball courts, tossing sports areas, walking paths, trailhead, reflection pond, and parking.

The funding for The Point's construction has been committed by 5.5 million dollars from private donations, 2.6 million dollars from The Land and Water Conservation Fund grant, and 2 million dollars pledged by The City of Pratt. The City of Pratt's contribution is expected to come in the form of a lease from a local bank and the debt will be serviced from a combination of hotel transient guest tax dollars and expected revenue from The Point usage fees. No ad valorem or sales tax dollars will be used in the construction of The Point. It is also expected that the on-going operational expenses of The Point will be substantially less than the revenue generated in the form of room rentals, memberships, team user fees, gate fees, concession proceeds, and advertisement.

The resolution accepted on Monday is a commitment by The City of Pratt to proceed with The Point Project in principle to honor and accept the very generous private donations to better Pratt. The Point Project has room for even more opportunities and amenities. A fundraising committee will continue to work on other fundraising and scholarship opportunities to take the Project to the next level.
